CEO's MESSAGE

As we come together tonight to celebrate the commitment of many longstanding Master Builders ACT Members, it is impossible to look back on recent years without acknowledging the profound impact that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the ACT community, our industry and our organisation.

The pandemic recovery phase demonstrated the benefits of the MBA Federation, which fiercely advocated to all levels of Government for significant economic stimulus for the building and construction industry.

At the end of last year, the ACT lockdown resulted in the closure of the building and construction industry for more than three weeks. The MBA worked closely with the ACT Government to have our industry reopened ahead of many other industries.

Despite the extensive challenges of the previous few years, our commitment to improving the building and construction industry as a whole has remained unchanged.

In the last 12 months we've added to our scope of training by acquiring Southern Training Organisation (STO). Master Builders ACT and STO have partnered for more than seven years to provide high-risk training for the construction industry in Canberra and Bega. As a result of this acquisition, we can now offer a greater range of training for our industry and build upon our reputation as a quality training provider.

Despite the headwinds of 2020 and 2021, the MBA made several investments which will help provide safer training and improved member services, including:

- Establishing MBA Legal, a fee-for-service law firm dedicated to providing affordable legal advice to MBA members.
- Expansion of our apprentice training workshop to allow safer training spaces for our students.
- Refurbishment of the MBA ground floor office, reception and classrooms.

Tonight, as we celebrate the incredible achievements of the building and construction industry, I would like to thank Members for their extreme resilience and ability to pivot as needed over the last 24 months. This industry has adapted to conditions that have never been seen before, to ensure the Canberra community has the housing and infrastructure necessary to continue to function as a capital city.

On behalf of the MBA, I would like to extend my sincerest gratitude and thanks to our Members, Executive Committee, Life Members and Honorary Members who continue to support the MBA. Congratulations to all of those who are here tonight celebrating membership milestones. Thank you to the sponsors of tonight's event who have made this celebration possible.

Reopening the Industry

In August 2021, the construction industry was closed as a result of the ACT lockdown. Master Builders ACT advocated fiercely on behalf of Members to the ACT Government calling for the reopening of the industry. Our advocacy included launching a petition calling on the ACT Government to safely reopen the construction industry for small-scale projects. The petition gathered over 7,400 signatures from the local building and construction community.

We are proud of the efforts made during this time and the commitment our Members displayed to ensure they adhered to changing safety requirements as the industry returned to work. With support from our members, and cooperation from other industry partners, the MBA's efforts were critical to securing the safe reopening of the industry after the ACT's lockdown.
